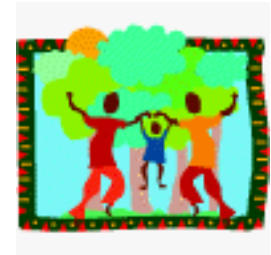

1. Experience:
 - a. Experience working in a family related field
 - b. Practical experience with high-conflict cases or litigation between parents
2. Education:
 - a. Bachelor's degree in counseling, education, family studies, psychology, or social work OR
 - b. Graduate degree in mental health profession, with emphasis in family & children's issues OR
 - c. Licensed Texas attorney
3. Specialized Training:
 - a. 8 hrs family violence dynamics
 - b. 40 hrs dispute resolution techniques in course approved by the court
 - c. 24 hrs in fields of family dynamics, child development, family law & law governing parenting coordination, & parenting coordination styles & procedures *[this course]*
